## **PRESENTER'S BIO:**



**PROF KEYMANTHRI MOODLEY**

Keymanthri Moodley is a specialist family physician and bioethicist. She has had a long academic career and is currently an Emeritus Professor at Stellenbosch University and an Adjunct Professor at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill, USA. To date, she has served as Principal Investigator on 5 NIH funded research projects and has substantial clinical trial experience. For over 2 decades, she has been involved in GCP and Research Ethics training and has served on DSMBs and RECs/IRBs. Over the past 8 years, Keymanthri has served on the Scientific Advisory Committee of EDCTP 2 and 3. She is a member of the Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf).

Keymanthri currently has over 150 publications (journals, books, book chapters) and is an NRF rated researcher. In 2026, she was appointed as an Associate Editor at the Journal of Medical Ethics. She also currently serves on the Ethics Advisory Board of UNITE4TB.

Over the past 15 years, Keymanthri has worked on various expert groups with the World Health Organisation (WHO). She currently co-chairs the WHO Working Group on Clinical Ethics, developing guidelines for clinical ethics consultation. Her most recent NIH funded research project explored ethical, legal and social issues (ELSI) in Big Data and Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Africa. Keymanthri currently co-chairs the WHO Ethics and AI Expert Group. In her current capacity as an independent bioethics consultant, she focuses on the governance and ethics of AI in healthcare and research.
